Heart Transplant Recipient Mike O'Brien 'To Give Back' To HeartBrothers Foundation

Ouincy police officer and recent heart transplant recipient Mike O'Brien will host a fundraiser on Feb. 4 to benefit The HeartBrothers Foundation (HBF).

O'Brien, who underwent a successful heart transplant last August, has an impressive story of commitment and determination. He has served 26 years with the Quincy Police Department and served in the U.S. Marines. He has battled congestive heart failure since 2015.

While in the hospital, O'Brien learned about HBF when a group member came to see him. Heart Brothers, who live with heart failure and are often heart transplant recipients themselves, routinely visit heart failure patients at Boston-

"Meeting the HeartBrothers helped me know I was not alone and helped me navigate the changes in my health," said O'Brien. "My new mission is to give back to an organization that has given so much to me."

The event to benefit The HeartBrothers Foundation will be on Sunday, Feb. 4 from 2 to 8 p.m. at the restaurant ALBA on 53, located at 2053 Washington Street in Hanover. The event will feature food and entertainment.

HBF serves thousands of heart failure patients with emotional and financial support, a patient support group, educational webinars and other resources. The foundation also runs the HeartBrothers House in Boston, where heart failure patients and their families can stay during treatment.

"Mike's story shows heart failure can affect anyone. We created The HeartBrothers Foundation to help patients like Mike. We are excited that he is now dedicated to helping even more people by spreading awareness of our organization and raising money to lessen the burden on other patients," said Pat Sullivan, co-founder of the HeartBrothers.


